Topic of discussion: "Transition into 6th Grade" led by Chad Gleason and Sara Ballute

Highlights of discussion:

Panel consisted of 4 former Cantiague students who are now in 6th grade. Various topics were discussed and questions answered from the audience.

Sixth Grade Schedule- what to expect

- 9 periods each day
- All week it is either a Day1 or Day2
- 2 teachers are assigned throughout the day for 2 periods
- Switching between classes
- Core 6-last period of the day used for community building, extra help, project based learning
- 1st bell is at 7:26 AM, lunch is at 10:27AM, last bell is at 2:03PM.
 2:07 PM-3:30 PM is after school extra help. All 6th graders need to leave school by 3:30PM
- There are two schedule decisions to make- language and music.

Sixth grade classes are on the lower level and contained to "6th grade Hallway"

Schedules go out in August and there are JMS visits and Unity Day where kids can get familiar with the school. Parents are welcome to walk the schedule through the school to help their kid transition to the new building and ease anxiety about getting lost.
